As we celebrate India's Independence Day in the State of Qatar, we also celebrate the deep-rooted friendly ties between India and Qatar, and renew our sincere thanks to His Highness Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, the Emir; His Highness Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, the Father Emir; His Excellency Sheikh Abdullah Bin Nasser bin Khalifa Al Thani, Prime Minister and Minister of Interior; and the Government and people of Qatar for all that they do to nurture the strong bonds of friendship and cooperation between our two great countries, and for their hospitality to the Indian community in Qatar.

The multi-hued cooperation between India and Qatar is flourishing within an excellent framework provided by historic relations and regular and substantive engagement, including at the highest levels of the two Governments. This is an illustrative and not an exhaustive list.

The well-being and welfare of Indian nationals in Qatar, especially of our workers and other compatriots in low income categories, are the highest priority for Embassy of India, Doha. We have a regular, active and inclusive interaction with and outreach to the Indian community, and render a large number of services to them efficiently and helpfully. As we celebrate our Independence Day, I heartily congratulate the large, diverse, accomplished and highly regarded Indian community in Qatar for their significant contribution in further strengthening the strong ties between the two countries.
